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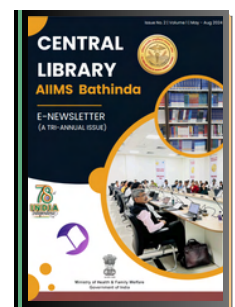
CENTRAL LIBRARY E-NEWSLETTER

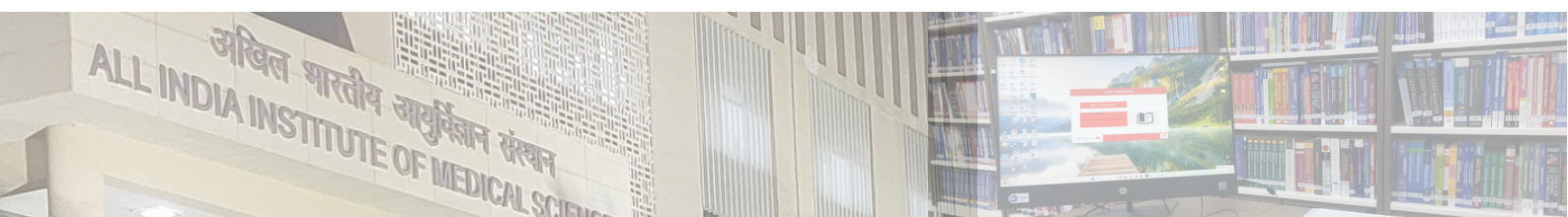

State-of-the-art hybrid technology (EM+RFID), allowing for seamless check-in and check-out of materials. Enhanced Magnetic (EM) security and Radio Frequency Identification (RFID) for efficient tracking and identification of books. This hybrid system provides a high level of security for library materials while allowing for faster, more accurate check-in and check-out processes. EM technology ensures the protection of library assets by triggering alarms if unauthorized removal of items occurs, while RFID enables automatic tracking and identification, significantly speeding up circulation transactions.

Did you know?



The Central Secretariat Library (CSL) is one of the oldest libraries of the Government of India and comes under Ministry of Culture. CSL is one of the largest tangible treasures of knowledge next to National Library, Kolkata for Indian and foreign document resources. In terms of size of collection 8,50,000 volumes (print or non-print).

HISTORICAL GENESIS: CSL's resources are an amalgamation of many old institutions including the resources of Imperial Secretariat Library, Calcutta that came into existence in 1891 during the period of Lord Curzon and validated by the Imperial Library Act of 1901. F.W. Forester, Curator of the Imperial Records Office, assembled about one thousand volumes lying about



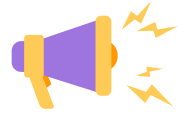
in the Writer's Building, Calcutta received under the press and Registration of Books Act, 1867. This collection along with variety of collections belonging to other secretariat libraries located in that building was named the Imperial Library which was



inaugurated on 11th May 1891. The Imperial Secretariat Library was transferred to Delhi in 1912 with the shifting of the Capital to Delhi and was housed in the Old Secretariat Building, Civil Lines Delhi. In 1913, part of the collection was moved to Shimla Secretariat.

With the inauguration of the new Secretariat in New Delhi on 10th February 1931, the Imperial Secretariat Library was moved into North Block, and the Secretariat Library which was functioning in Shimla was also amalgamated with the Imperial Secretariat Library. On 1st April 1948, the library was named as Central Secretariat Library. In 1969 the Library was shifted to the newly constructed Shastri Bhawan, housing the Ministry of Education, the 'G' wing of the building was allotted to CSL. CSL also has a text book library located at R.K. Puram, New Delhi.



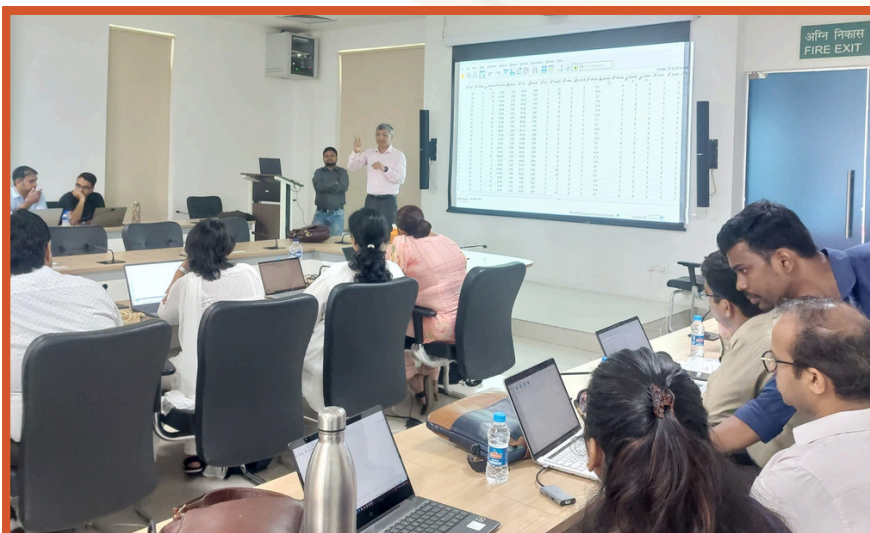


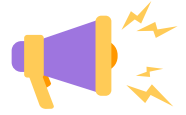
SPSS training and workshop

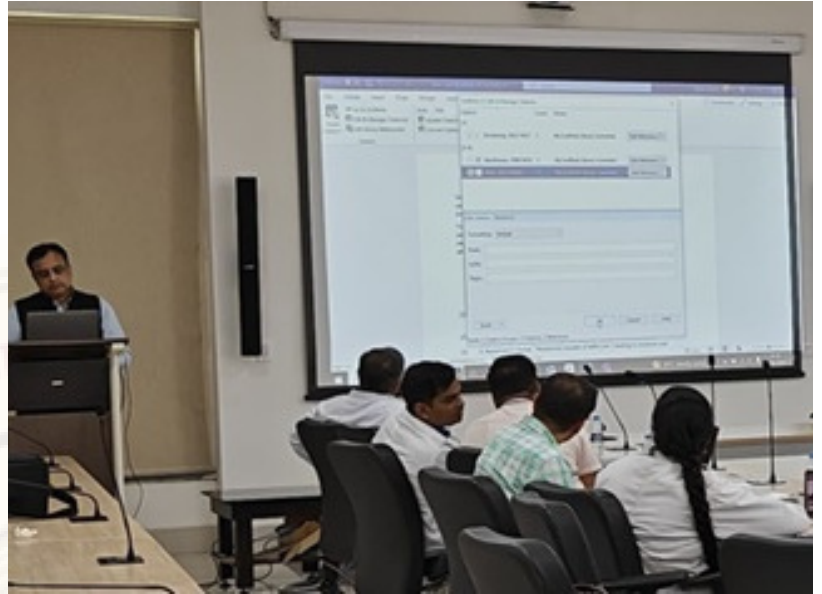

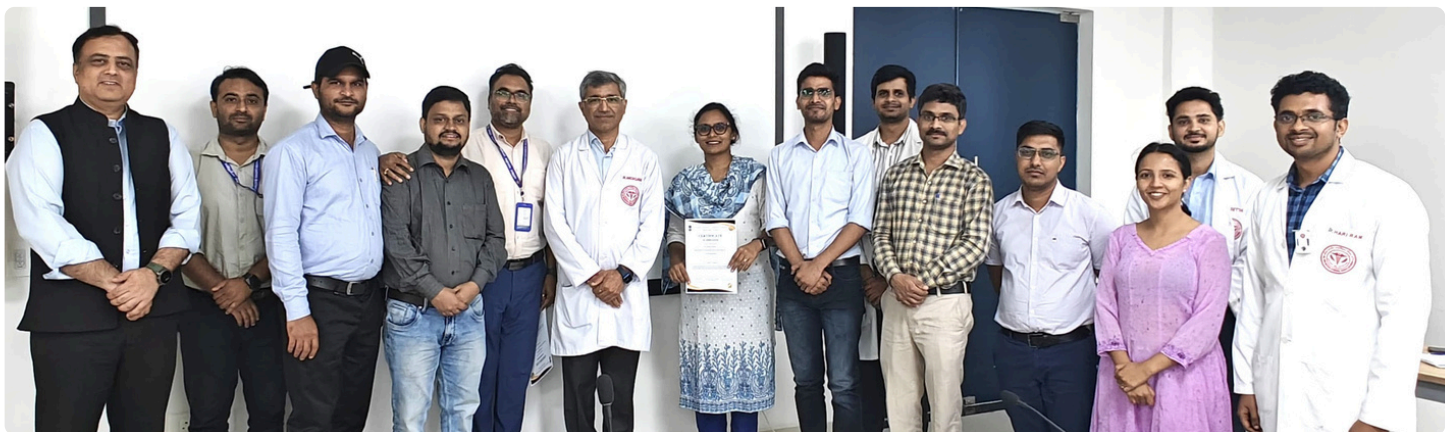


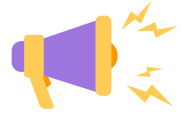
A training on EndNote (Reference Management Software)

EndNote is a widely used commercial reference management software that helps users efficiently manage bibliographies and references while writing essays, reports, and articles. This workshop provided participants with essential skills to streamline the process of organizing and citing sources, making the task of referencing and creating bibliographies much more efficient and accurate.



By attending this workshop, participants gained valuable insights into EndNote's features, including citation styles, reference organization, and integration with word processors, enhancing their ability to manage research materials and improve the quality of their academic writing. 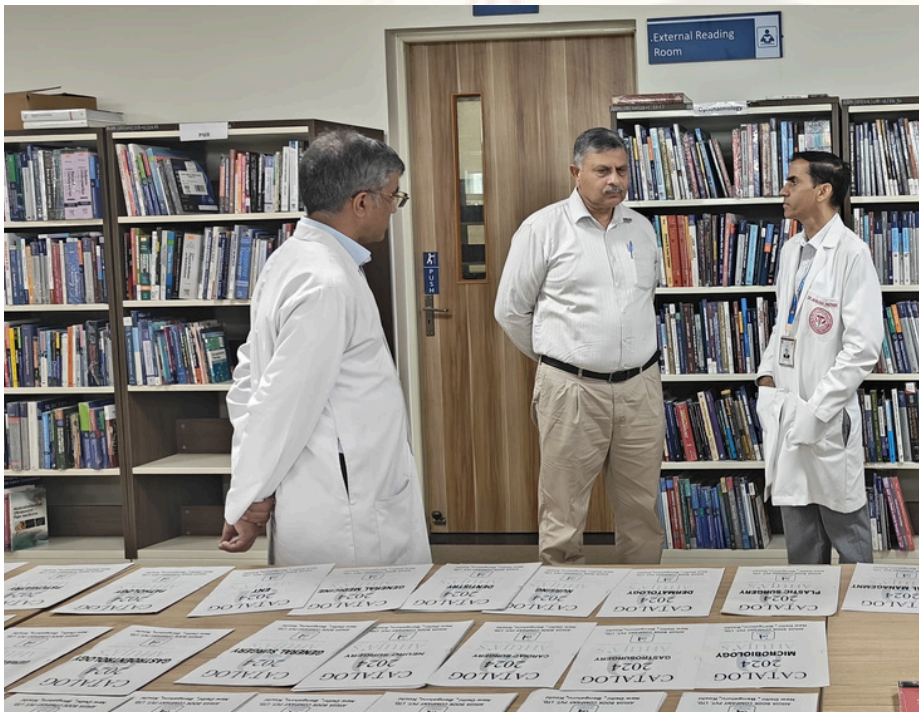




Events

One Nation One Subscription (ONOS)

The One Nation One Subscription (ONOS) intends to acquire national licenses for e-journal/database subscriptions from most of the prominent journal publishers. All the journals published by these publishers will be accessible to the students, faculty members and researchers of the participating institutions. The ONOS is starting its operation from 1st January 2025. Access to journals are being provided through national subscription coordinated by the Information and Library Network (INFLIBNET) Centre, Gandhinagar, Gujarat. The Department of Higher Education, Government of India will have a unified portal "One Nation One Subscription" (<https://www.onos.gov.in/>) through which the institutions will be able to access the journals.

Total of 30 major international journal publishers have been included in ONOS.
