



The Academic Section develops policy and plans, and executes academic activities. These activities encompass the undergraduate programmes for medical and nursing. These activities are conducted by the undergraduate and paramedical cells. The department functions under the Administrative Control of Dean (Academic) supported by Associate Dean (Academic) and Registrar.

#### **UNDERGRADUATE EDUCATION**

The section handles postadmission formalites for new students, develops and revses curriculam and administers teaching programmes including internal assessment of undergraduate students admitted to various courses. The courses include MBBS, and BSc (Hons) Nursing courses.

#### **Bachelor of Medicine and Bachelor of Surgery (MBBS)**

The MBBS course is of 5½ years duration and comprises of 3 phases and an internship. The details are as follows:

At present, 100 Indian students are admitted every year to the MBBS course (41 General Category, 15 Scheduled Caste, 7 Scheduled Tribe, 27 Other Backward Classes and 10 economically weaker section). These admissions were made based on merit through an All-India Entrance Examination. For persons with disabilities (PWD), 5% reservation was provided on a horizontal basis. Soon the institute will be starting new postgraduate courses.

#### II. Brief Introduction of the department:

The department of Burns & Plastic Surgery at the All-India Institute of Medical Sciences Bathinda Punjab was established in July 2021 with the joining of Dr. M. Altaf Mir as Associate Professor on 27th of July 2021. Then Dr. Rajesh K Maurya joined as Assistant Professor on 2nd of August 2021.

The Department is rapidly increasing the spectrum of reconstruction and undertaking the major reconstruction surgeries in head and neck cancer patients, hand and lower limb injuries, post skin malignancy defects, oculoplastic surgery, and almost all the congenital and acquired defects and deformity of anatomical body parts.

Micro-vascular tissue transfers like free Flaps; repair of nerve and vessel injuries, Brachial plexus surgery and lymphedema surgery is being routinely done. Corrective surgeries and rehabilitation of post burn deformity, post burn scarring and limb deformity is done. Pediatric Congenital deformity like syndactyly, polydactyly, hypospadias, cleft lip-palate, club hand is being corrected. Aesthetic Surgeries like otoplasty, rhinoplasty, abdominoplasty, breast reduction, gynaecomastia correction, and scar revision is being done. Minor surgical procedure room has being set up in the outpatient clinic and in Burns & Plastic Surgery Ward.

The Department is planning to establish micro vascular training lab for teaching and training of residents and establishment of dedicated 20 bedded Burn unit with modern facilities with HDU and dedicated Burn OT for care of Acute Burn patients in near future.

The Department has already applied for approval of admission for One M.Ch. superspeciality seat per session (semester) and post doctoral certificate course (PDCC) two seats per year.






#### C. COVID CARE Helpline, AIIMS Bathinda







This programme will help us to identify an ADR, if they suspect any and also tell them about the availability of the ADR forms or how and where they can report the same.

#### **Outcome of the Training**

All the participants got the brief understanding regarding the importance of Adverse Drug Reaction and its reporting for the safety of the consumers. In this training, we have illustrated the detailed guidance of reporting the Adverse Drug Reactions to AMC or how can they send the report to the both AMC or IPC. Also, demonstration of the suspected ADR reporting forms was presented in detail and each section of the form was explained for better understanding. The doubts were discussed in between the presentation if any raised by the person attending. Participants assured that they understood it well but still if any doubts are



There can be discussed any time in future with the help of PV Associate or coordinators. The purpose of the training was fulfilled as all were acknowledged with the type of reactions they can report, how and to whom they can report.

More importantly, we have cleared the doubts of the listeners regarding the reporter details by making them believe that the reporter's detail is purely confidential and would never be used for any medico legal purpose. Additionally, participants understood the priority of reporting the ADR with the motivation being provided to them by giving the examples of individuals (within the hospital and outside the hospital) who have reported. We have focused to provide them convenient ways to report the ADRs by distributing the print outs of suspected ADR reporting forms and also made the form available on the AIIMS website. Details of helpline numbers of the AMC as well as IPC were provided in the form of posters which would be helpful for them in case of any difficulty while reporting the ADRs.



#### II. Brief Introduction of the department:

The Department of Psychiatry started functioning after the inauguration of the outpatient services at AIIMS, Bathinda w.e.f. 23-12-2020. The manpower at the time of inception of psychiatry OPD consisted of two faculty members namely Dr. Jitender Aneja, Associate Professor and Dr. Bharat Udey, Assistant Professor. Dr. Jawahar Singh has joined the department on 30<sup>th</sup> August 2021 and Dr Gurvinder Pal Singh Joined recently on 29<sup>th</sup> April, 2022.

Broadly we are catering to children, adolescents, adults and elderly patients with psychological issues or psychiatric disorders, substance use disorders and sexual disorders. In our outdoor clinic we are serving to patients with common mental disorders, severe mental illness, psychosomatic disorders, stress related problems, childhood disorders, geriatric problems, substance use disorders, marital and psychosexual disorders etc. We are seeing new patients as well as referred patients from other departments of AIIMS Bathinda and outside. We are providing pharmacotherapy, and psychological testing (presently limited) and therapies like psychoeducation, behavioral therapy, psychotherapy, abreaction treatments and teaching various relaxation exercises.

Special clinics being run are: Drug Deaddiction Clinic (DDC) (Tuesday & Friday), Child and Adolescent Psychiatry Clinic (CAPC) (Saturday), Geriatric Mental Health Clinic (GMHC) (Wednesday), Marital & Psychosexual Clinic (MPC; Wednesday), and Psychological Interventions (Thursday).



The department aims to become a center of excellence for complex gastrointestinal, hepatobiliary, and pancreatic surgeries. We endeavor to offer clinical and technical skills of the highest standards at affordable prices to all strata of society alike.

The department was established on 7<sup>th</sup> September 2021. OPD services were started in second week of September. Surgical services were started on 24 February 2022 and official IPD beds were allocated on 3<sup>rd</sup> March 2022.

Currently the department runs outpatient clinics and specialty sub-clinics three times a week. The department conducts elective surgeries on two days a week and emergency procedures on a need basis. The department has a fully functional IPD, with 15 beds; the patients requiring hospitalization for gastrointestinal problems are admitted to the IPD. # Advanced gastrointestinal surgeries begins at AIIMS Bathinda

#### ANIL VERMA BATHINDA, MAR 31

In one of the significant milestones, a highly complex surgery (Whipple's procedure) was successfully performed for a pancreatic tumor by the department of surgical gastroenterology at AIIMS Bathinda. This challenging procedure was performed on a patient with a neuroendocrine tumor in the head of the pancreas.

The surgery, which lasted for about 6 hours, was performed by Dr. Gourav Kaushal(Gastro surgeon) with the assistance of Dr. Anil Mehta (Resident); Dr. Shashank led the anesthesia team. The patient is doing well on 30-day follow-up. Pancreatic surgeries are complex procedures and are performed in selected highly specialized centers. Earlier patients had to go to either Chandigarh. Ludhiana, or New Delhi for such surgeries, but now people



of this region and adjoining states can get complex Gastrointestinal surgeries done at AIIMS Bathinda at meager costs.

The Director Bathinda, Professor Singh, expressed his pleasure and satisfaction with this achievement. He said the institute is inching toward achieving its mandate of providing holistic, state-of-the-art healthcare to all the strata of society by establishing this tertiary care institute in the region. Professor Satish Gupta, Dean of AIIMS Bathinda, also conveyed that the region's people can save valuable time and money to treat gastrointestinal problems with the addition of gastrointestinal surgery services at AIIMS. The department of Surgical Gastroenterology was established in September 2021 and has an experienced faculty who has worked in top healthcare systems like JIPMER, AIIMS Rishikesh, and Max healthcare before joining AIIMS Bathinda.

The department runs OPD Services every Monday, Wednesday, and Friday. Complex gastrointestinal surgeries are performed routinely with outcomes comparable to current international standards.

#### **Registration Desk**

The real time HMIS streamlines the treatment flow of patients and simultaneously empowering workforce to perform to their peak ability, in an optimized and efficient manner. It is modeled on the unique combination of a 'patient centric and medical staff centric' paradigm, thus providing benefits to both the recipients and the providers of healthcare. It ensures dramatic improvement in performance along with reducing the costs. A data warehouse of such records can be utilized for statistical requirements and for research.

The HMIS ensures that users do not spend hours in patient registration and lab tests. Hospital HMIS system generates a unique ID for every new patient registration and lab samples. Patients OPD slip has a unique ID on it and only takes seconds to scan and offer hospital services like revisits, billing, pharmacy services etc. Each patient after OPD registration moves to vital examination desk. On the vital examination desk trained health personnel who measure pulse, respiration and blood pressure of patients.

Multi-specialty OPD services aim to providing patient centric care were started in the specialty areas of General Medicine, Surgery, Gynecology& Obstetrics, Orthopedics, ENT, Ophthalmology, Dermatology, Psychiatry, Dentistry, Radiotherapy, and Anesthesiology which are functioning from Monday to Saturday. The clinics focus on the preventive, promotive and curative aspect of health care services on an outpatient basis. Immunization clinic has also been started with support from the state Government to provide vaccines under the Universal Immunization Program by Government of India including the COVID-19 vaccines.

The hospital brings together some of the most talented medical professionals in the country and has a dedicated team of clinicians to provide highest standards of patient care. There is provision of consultation chambers where patients are provided medical, surgical or allied consultation, examination and expert opinion, Day care rooms where patients can be examined for any disease condition.







## Laboratory Services: Laboratory at AIIMS Bathinda

The central diagnostic lab is being run jointly along with Hind Labs vide a MoU signed with AIIMS Bathinda. Hind Labs being the service provider is supplying all the manpower and equipment required whereas the validation of equipment and results is being done by faculty of AIIMS Bathinda.

**Biochemistry:** Investigation panel includes routine biochemical tests, thyroid function tests, hormones, vitamin assays and others.

**Microbiology:** Investigations include serological tests, screening for STDs, immunological tests, bacterio logical cultures.

**Pathology:** Investigations include routine haematological indices, cytology, and histopathology.

State of the art equipment has been procured by Hind labs which include Dry chemistry analyzers, fully automate danalyzers, chemi-luminescence immunoassay and cell counter with further scope of expansion into newer machine and technology.




**Learning Management System (LMS): -** Platforms that are implemented by IT Cell and are usedfor LMS as mentioned below: -




Hospital Management Information System (HMIS):- HMIS called eSushrut has started functioning from day-one of beginning of the OPD services and is a major step towards adapting technology to improve healthcare. This HMIS incorporates an integrated computerized clinical information system for improved hospital administration and patient health care. It also provides an accurate, electronically stored medical record (EMR) of the patient. An Electronic Health Record (EHR) is an electronic version of a patient's longitudinal health record. EHR may contain medical history, diagnosis, medications, treatment plans, immunization dates, allergies and test results of a patient across time. Modules which are currently working in HMIS are:

The scheme is particularly useful during times of pandemic Covid-19 as it helps people avoid going out to consult a doctor or visit a hospital. Through eSanjeevani OPD, anyone can seek medical advice and medication through audio and video. With the introduction ofthis service, people living in the remotest areas will also be able to get their health-related consultation.



AIIMS Bathinda started Teleconsultation using portal eSanjeevani OPD. Admin Panel in which new entries of doctors for various departments, record updation is maintained by IT Cell.




Online OPD Registration: - Online Registration System (ORS) is a framework to link various hospitals across the country for Aadhaar based online registration and appointment system where counter based OPD registration and appointment system through Hospital Management Information System (HMIS) has been digitalized. Portal facilitates online appointments with various departments of different Hospitals using eKYC data of Aadhaar number if patient's mobile number is registered with UIDAI. And in case the mobile number is not registered with UIDAI it uses patient's name. New Patients will get appointment as well as Unique Health Identification (UHID) number. If



Aadhaar number is already linked with UHID number, then appointment number will be given and UHID will remain the same.

AIIMS Bathinda started online appointment using ORS portal. Admin Panel in which new entries of doctors for various departments, OPD schedule, record updation is maintained by IT Cell.



**Network:** AIIMS Bathinda signed MoU with the National Knowledge Network (NKN) for the internet connectivity and 1 GBPS internet link is working in AIIMS Bathinda. OIC IT is the nodal officer and IT Cell is coordinating with the NKN regarding the network related works.

OIC IT is the nodal officer for the same and IT Cell is operating admin panel of NIC Email services. 



# Introduction:

All India Institute of Medical Sciences, Bathinda (Punjab) is a Central autonomous body under aegis of Ministry of Health and Family Welfare under PMSSY Division. A Gazette Notification was issued on 04th Dec 2019 for establishment of the All India Institute of Medical Sciences at Bathinda in Punjab. The Government of Punjab transferred land measuring 175 acres to the Central Government in Nov, 2016 for establishment of AllMS Bathinda. The PGIMER, Chandigarh was the mentor institute of AIIMS, Bathinda and the OPD/IPD services was started w.e.f. 23<sup>rd</sup> December 2019.

# 1. Accounting Convention

The books of accounts of All India Institute of Medical Sciences, Bathinda (Punjab) have been maintained on the basis of Accrual basis of Accounting.

# 2. Inventory Valuation

The Inventory of the Institute i.e. stores & spares consumables has been valued at cost price. The costs have been worked out on the First in First Out (FIFO) method.

Separate Audit Report of the Comptroller & Auditor General of India on the Accounts of the All India Institute of Medical Sciences (AIIMS), Bathinda, Punjab for the year ended 31 March 2022

We have audited the Balance Sheet of All India Institute of Medical Sciences, Bathinda, Punjab as on 31st March 2022, Income and Expenditure Account and Receipts and Payments Account for the year ended on that date under Section 19 (2) of the Comptroller and Auditor General's (Duties, Power and Conditions of Service) Act, 1971 read with Section 18 (2) of the All India Institute of Medical Sciences (AIIMS) Act, 1956.

- 2. This Separate Audit Report contains the comments of the Comptroller & Auditor General of India (CAG) on the accounting treatment only with regard to classification, conformity with the best accounting practices, accounting standards and disclosure norms, etc. Audit observations on financial transactions with regard to compliance with the Law, Rules & Regulations (Propriety and Regularity) and efficiency-cumperformance aspects, etc., if any, are reported through Inspection Reports/CAG's Audit Reports separately.
- 3. We have conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in India. These standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatements. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidences supporting the amounts and disclosure in the financial statements. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of financial statements. We believe that our audit provides a reasonable basis for our opinion.
- 4. Based on our audit, we report that:
- i) We have obtained all the information and explanations, which to the best of our knowledge and belief were necessary for the purpose of our audit;
- ii) The Balance Sheet and Income and Expenditure Account/Receipts and Payments Account dealt with by this Report have been drawn up in the Uniform format prescribed by the Ministry of Finance, Government of India;
- iii) In our opinion, proper books of accounts and other relevant records have been maintained by the All India Institute of Medical Sciences, Bathinda, Punjab in so far as it appears from our examination of such books.

### A. Balance Sheet

# A.1 Corpus/ Capital Fund and Liabilities Earmarked/ Endowment/ Corpus Fund (Schedule 3): ₹ 3034.94 lakh

**A.1.1** As per Rule 230 (8) of General Financial Rules (GFR) 2017, "All interest or other earnings against Grant in Aid or advance (other than reimbursement) released to any Grantee Institution should mandatorily be remitted to the Consolidated Fund of India immediately after finalization of the accounts. Such advances should not be allowed to be adjusted against future releases"

Above did not include interest of ₹ 81.45<sup>1</sup> lakh earned on grant funds during 2021-22. This interest income was incorrectly depicted as Income as Interest earned (Schedule 17).Interest earned on grant funds should have been booked as liability under Current Liabilities & Provisions, instead of booking the same as Income. This has resulted in understatement of Earmarked/ Endowment/ Corpus Fund and overstatement of Interest Earned by ₹ 81.45 lakh.

Keeping in view the aforesaid GFR 230 (8), interest earned on grant funds of earlier years, which was not remitted to the Consolidated Fund of India, should also be worked out and provisions for remittances of the same should be made in the annual accounts.

A.1.2 As per HITES<sup>2</sup>'s Statement, an amount ₹ 3.11 crore was accrued as interest income on the advances released to it for various construction works and supply of equipments. However, the Institute has not booked this interest accrued in its books of accounts. Keeping in view the aforesaid GFR 230 (8), provision for remittance of the same should have been made in the annual accounts. Non-accounting of interest accrued on advances released from grants funds has resulted in understatement of Current Assets, Loans & Advances as well as Current Liabilities by ₹ 3.11 crore.

### A.2 Assets

# A.2.1 Fixed Assets (Schedule 8): ₹ 728.89 lakh

(i) The Institute had shown value of Library Books as Nil. However, library books amounting to ₹56.23 lakh which were received in March 2022 were not included under Fixed Assets. This has resulted in understatement of Fixed Assets by ₹ 33.74 lakh (after depreciation at the rate of 40 percent per annum) and understatement of depreciation by ₹ 22.49 lakh and understatement of Current Liabilities by ₹ 56.23 lakh.

### (ii) Capital Work in Progress: ₹ 618.29 crore

As per HITES's Expenditure Statement, advances for supplying Hospital Equipments of ₹ 39. 20 crore were outstanding with it as on 31.03.2022. However, the Institute had shown outstanding capital advances as Nil. The Institute has directly booked the funds released by MOHFW to HITES as capital work in progress (CWIP), instead of booking the expenditure incurred as per the "Expenditure Statement" of HITES. This has resulted in understatement of Current Assets, Loans & Advances and overstatement of Capital Work in Progress by ₹ 39.20 crore

### B. General

# B.1 Net impact of Audit comments on the Annual Accounts

Net impact of Audit comments on the annual accounts of the Institute for the year ending 31 March 2022 is as under:

- i. Assets understated by ₹ 3.45 crore.
- ii. Liabilities understated by ₹ 4.48 crore.
- iii. Corpus/Capital Fund overstated by ₹ 1.03 crore. Besides, the Income is overstated by ₹ 1.03 crore
- **B.2** Works amounting to ₹ 420.07 crore were completed by the executing agency (HITES). Out of this amount of ₹ 420.07 crore, the Institute had transferred an amount of ₹ 89.13 crore only to buildings. It has been observed that various buildings for the balance amount of ₹ 330.94 crore, were though completed in the years 2020-21 and 2021-22, however were not taken over by the Institute. Reasons for not taking over of these buildings were, neither recorded nor intimated. These facts alongwith reasons for

not taking over completed buildings despite completion should have been recorded and disclosed by way of Notes to Accounts.

B.3 Ministry of Education vide O.M. No. F. No. 19-1/2017-IFD dated 27 January 2022 communicated that Ministry of Finance has clarified that Autonomous bodies may adopt Payment of Gratuity Act, 1972 administered by the Ministry of Labour and Employment and the issue relating to implementation of Payment of Gratuity Act may be taken up with Ministry of Labour and Employment directly or through Ministry of Education. Further, Integrated Finance Division, Department of Higher Education, Ministry of Education, to ensure a uniform position across all ABs, has moved a proposal for seeking the approval of Ministry of Labour and Employment.

The Institute has made provisions of Gratuity in its annual accounts. The Institute should have taken up the matter with its controlling Ministry for clarification and accordingly the fact should have been disclosed in the Notes to Accounts.

**B.4** The policy regarding accounting treatment of HEFA Loan and Assets acquired through it and policy regarding capitalisation of these assets was not disclosed.

- C.2 In the Schedule 3, the Institute had shown balance of 'Grant in Aid for General (OH-31) amounting to ₹5.87 crore, instead of ₹ 2.47 crore as worked out above in Sl.no. C.1. Reasons for difference of ₹ 3.40 crore were as under:-
  - (i) The Institute had incorrectly included 'Internal Receipts' of

    ₹ 4.65 crore in the Grant Balance.
  - (ii) Further, it was pointed out in the previous year Separate Audit Report (vide comment at Sl.no. C. (i)) that the Institute had adjusted previous deficit of ₹1.25 crore from Grant in Aid General.

However, formal approval/regularization from the Government/ Ministry was not received in the year 2021-22 also. In the absence of Government approval/regularization, the deficit of ₹ 1.25 crore should have been met from Internally Revenue Generation, instead of meeting the same from Grant funds.

Therefore, the actual balance in 'OH-31, Grant in Aid for General' was ₹ 2.47 crore (₹ 5.87 crore+ ₹ 1.25 crore - ₹ 4.65 crore).

- C.3 In the Schedule 3, the Institute had shown balance of Grant in Aid for Salary, (OH-36) amounting to ₹1.84 crore, instead of ₹ 19.87 crore as worked out above in Sl.no. C.1. Reasons for difference of ₹ 18.03 crore were as under:-
  - (i) It was pointed out in the previous year Separate Audit Report (vide comment at Sl.no. C. (ii)) that the Institute had negative balance of ₹ 14.10 crore under the head 'Grant in Aid Salary'. However, formal approval/regularization from the Government/ Ministry was not received in the year 2021-22 also. In the absence of Government approval/ regularization, deficit (negative balance) of ₹ 14.10 crore should
  - (ii) Retirement and Terminal Benefits amounting to ₹ 3.93 crore (₹ 1.12 crore + ₹ 2.81 crore, as per Schedule 7) should not have been deducted from Grant balances as these represents only notional expenditure.

Therefore, the actual balance in 'Grant in Aid for Salary' was ₹ 19.87 crore (₹ 1.84 crore+ ₹ 14.10 crore + ₹ 3.93 crore).



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As commented at Sl.no. C.1, C.2 and C.3above, the Institute should correct grant balances in the Schedule 3, accordingly.

D. Management letter

Deficiencies which have not been included in the Audit report have been brought to the notice of the Institute's management through a management letter issued separately for remedial/corrective action.

However, many cases have been noticed where, the voucher is signed by only one person while the column "prepared by and authorized by" remains unsigned in vouchers. The Institute replied that there is only one sanctioned post of Accounts Officer in accounts department.

# 3. System of Physical verification of Fixed Assets

Physical verification of fixed assets was not conducted for the year 2021-22.

# 4. System of Physical verification of Inventory

Physical verification of Inventory was not conducted.

# 5. Regularity in Payment of Statutory dues

As per books of accounts, the Institute was regular in depositing statutory dues.

# PART B: Other Irregularities noticed during the audit of accounts of the Institute for the vear 2021-22 which have not been included in the Separate Audit Report

# B.1 Balance Sheet

Assets

Current Assets, Loans, Advances etc. (Schedule 11) Sundry Debtors, receivables: ₹ 1.78 lakh

Above did not include rent receivable of ₹ 1.71 lakh from the vendors of Amul milk booths. This has resulted in understatement of Current Assets, Loans & Advances as well as Income by ₹ 1.71 lakh.

### B.2 General

**B.2.1** As per expenditure statement (Construction work) of HITES, an expenditure (Additions) of ₹104.22 crore was incurred during the year 2021-22. However, work wise details of expenditure of ₹104.22 crore were not furnished.



B.2.2 As per the accounting practices, expenditure on account of prior period and extra ordinary items are required to be disclosed separately in the Income & Expenditure Account so that the effect thereof on the net expenditure for the year is known.

However, prior period expenditure amounting to ₹ 1.79 crore was neither shown separately in the financial statements, nor any disclosure regarding the same was given in the Notes to Accounts.
